






Thank you to everyone who dressed up or joined us for our book swap for World Book Day. It was a great success with













A World Book Day Fact File researched and written by J-T (Year 4)

World Book Day changes lives through a love of books and shared reading and was originally started in April 1985 as a way to help children fall in love with books and reading. Charities are donated as a way to also help children and families who wouldn't normally be able to buy these books.

In 1995, UNESCO decided that The World Book and Copyright Day would be celebrated on the 23rd of April, as the date is the anniversary of the death of William Shakespeare and Garcilaso de la Vega and the birth and death of several other writers.

Originally, Vicente Clavel Andrés, a Valencian book writer, suggested that the day should be on a day that honoured the author Miguel de Cervantes. This would be either his birthday, October 7th, or his death date, April 23rd.
